## Colleagues,

We are writing to confirm that your units, colleges and departments should continue to abide by Governor Whitmer's "Stay Home, Stay Safe" order, **which has been extended through April 30** in the Governor's new <u>Executive Order No. 2020-42</u>. The order states, "To suppress the spread of COVID-19, to prevent the state's health care system from being overwhelmed ... it is reasonable and necessary to direct residents to remain at home or in their place of residence to the maximum extent feasible."

As outlined in the <u>HR Guidelines Memo</u> from March 24, and pursuant to the executive order, the University still requires all employees who are **not** necessary to (a) sustain or protect life, or (b) conduct minimum basic operations, to stay at home rather than physically report to work at their worksites.

Employees who are working at home should continue to do so, in accordance with direction from their supervisors. Employees must also comply with the executive order.

Any employee whose physical presence at their place of work **is** necessary to (a) sustain or protect life, or (b) conduct minimum basic operations, must be designated as "necessary" and continue to report to their place of work. Units must determine which employees are designated as "necessary."
